HIV Stigma in Faith Spaces

- Silence
- Homophobic and transphobic messaging
- Framing HIV in connection to sexual orientation
- Shaming behavioral choices
- Misinformed interpretations of sacred texts
- Harmful and dangerous theologies



Challenging HIV Stigma in Faith Spaces

- Support candid institutional and community dialogue about sexual and reproductive health
- Host HIV/AIDS discussions in settings outside of faith gathering space
- Create an HIV/AIDS or social justice ministry
- Use social media outlets to reach community members with HIV/AIDS prevention and education messages
- Engage the media (e.g., TV, radio, newspapers, magazines, blogs) in HIV/AIDS awareness
- Work with other faith leaders on HIV/AIDS campaigns
- Convene regular meetings of diverse, interfaith, leaders to discuss HIV/AIDS





Why Faith Spaces are the Right Place for Action

- Eighty-three percent of adults in the South say religion is important in their lives (Pew Research Center)
- Therefore, faith spaces can play an influential role in HIV

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Building Trust in HIV and Faith Work

Need to address HIV stigma in Faith Spaces

- stigma
- homophobic and transphobic messages
- framing HIV in connection to sexual orientation
- shaming behavioral choices
- misinformed interpretations of sacred texts
- harmful and dangerous theologies



Why Faith Spaces are the Right Place for Action

- Eighty-three percent of adults in the South say religion is important in their lives
- Nearly 10,000 churches have people living with HIV as members
- Attitudes toward same sex marriage among Black church-going people is becoming more positive (57% in 2021 vs 44% in 2017)



Nonprofit organizations (n=4) and people living with HIV (n=3).

Urban and rural areas of NC (Eastern NC, Triangle region, Triad region, Piedmont, Western Piedmont, NC)

19 who identify as women, 41 identify as men, ranging in age from 25 to 75.
