Covered Outpatient Drugs and 340B Pricing




340B Pricing Cornerstones


- Manufacturers participating in the Medicaid Drug Rebate Program (MDRP) must offer 340B prices on covered outpatient drugs (CODs) to participating covered entities
 - Must offer the 340B ceiling price (or below) to covered entities if the drug is made available to any other purchaser at any price
 - Calculation based on formula set by law

Delivering 340B Pricing



340B Ceiling Price Calculation


- Pricing components based on complex pricing formulas and reporting required by CMS
- HRSA publishes the 340B ceiling price quarterly in 340B OPAIS based on pricing data provided by the manufacturer



AMP = average manufacturer price URA = unit rebate amount



Working Together to Ensure Accurate Pricing






Distributor Roles and Responsibilities

- Open 340B accounts only for eligible entities
 - Various identifier (DEA, HIN, 340B ID)
 - Contract pharmacies present unique challenges
- Deliver correct price to 340B entities
- Integrate with 340B vendor software
- Provide support for limited distribution products
- Process chargebacks with manufacturer correctly

Manufacturer Roles and Responsibilities

- Offer covered outpatient drugs to 340B covered entities at a price no higher than the calculated ceiling price
- Calculate the 340B ceiling price and report pricing components to CMS
 - A 340B ceiling price that calculates to an amount <\$0.01 will be published in 340B
 OPAIS as \$0.01 and the manufacturer must charge \$0.01 per unit
 - Maintain records for at least 3 years
- Send quarterly price files to wholesaler for appropriate account loads
- Load and reconcile pricing data in 340B OPAIS quarterly




Manufacturer Roles and Responsibilities (continued)

- Verify covered entity eligibility based on chargebacks
- Estimate 340B ceiling price on the date the drug is first available for sale using WAC until AMP is available
- Offer repayment if entities are overcharged for 340B drugs
 - Manufacturers that "knowingly and intentionally" overcharge more than ceiling price may be subject to a civil monetary penalty (CMP) for each instance of overcharging plus repayment amount

Examples of COD pricing

- 340B ceiling price: manufacturer-calculated price for 340B CODs according to the statutory formula
- PVP sub-340B: contracted pricing available to PVP participants below the ceiling price negotiated by the Prime Vendor with the manufacturer on behalf of 340B CEs



Examples of non-COD pricing

- PVP value-added: contracted pricing available to PVP participants on non-CODs such as certain vaccines, blood glucose monitoring supplies, prescription vials and labels, etc.
- No contract pricing: price loaded at a non-contracted price, such as wholesale acquisition cost (WAC)

Case Study – 340B Price Validation

A pharmacy buyer goes to purchase a 340B drug and the list price is noticeably higher than the prior order

Omeprazole 20mg
Order qty: 1 bottle
Total \$26.99


Invoice #	#4338 Date: 3/	23/2023
Unit cost	Order quantity	Total
\$7.22	1 bottle	\$7.22

What could be reasons for price discrepancy?



Steps to Resolve an Inaccurate 340B Price


- Check the labeler code on 340B
 OPAIS and/or MDRP website to help
 determine if the drug is a COD in
 MDRP and subsequently should
 have a 340B price
- 2. Validate the correct price using the 340B OPAIS pricing system (AO/PC)





Steps to Resolve an Inaccurate 340B Price

- 3. For Prime Vendor participants, verify the selling price accuracy by visiting the PVP secure website
- 4. Work with the distributor and/or manufacturer directly to resolve the pricing issue



 340B OPAIS is the source of truth for ceiling price information



Case Study – Invoice Price Discrepancy

A pharmacy buyer tells you that the 340B invoice price of atorvastatin has changed since the last time you purchased it. You notice it's a new quarter and suspect the 340B price may have changed, so you navigate to 340B OPAIS to check the current price:

- Drug: Atorvastatin 40 mg 1,000 count bottle
- NDC: 12345-6789-01
- 340B invoice price from distributor: \$98
- 340B OPAIS lists ceiling price as \$0.10 and the package adjusted price as \$100



Case details:

- 340B invoice price from distributor: \$98
- 340B OPAIS lists ceiling price as \$0.10 and the package adjusted price as \$100

What is the difference between the ceiling price and the package adjusted price on 340B OPAIS?

Ceiling price (\$0.10) is calculated at the billing unit level

Package adjusted price (\$100) is calculated at the selling unit level and should reflect the same package size as the invoice


- Package size: 1,000 tablets
- Case package size: 1 bottle

What could be reasons that the invoice price (\$98) is different from the 340B OPAIS package adjusted price (\$100)?

- Wholesale distribution fees/discounts
- PVP-contracted pricing
- Individual manufacturer contracts on 340B account.



PVP Contract Details





Supporting Account Load Integrity

- PVP team reviews distributor price files to ensure accurate PVP contract price loads
- PVP provides a current list of participating covered entities to manufactures to assist with correct contract pricing access



Manufacturer Refund Process

- Manufacturer must contact covered entities and notify HRSA in writing on intention to issue refund
- HRSA may post the letter on its website:
 http://www.hrsa.gov/opa/manufacturernotices/index.html
- Timeframe for new drug refunds: within 120 days of the determination by the manufacturer that an overcharge occurred
- For overcharges on other drugs, HRSA expects repayment procedures to follow similar processes that align with standard business practice and be documented in the manufacturer's policies and procedures
- The manufacturer may issue refunds to the covered entities directly, or use a service such as the Manufacturer Refund Service (through the PVP)



Takeaways

- Manufacturers and distributors have important roles in supporting program integrity
- There are resources available to verify the 340B ceiling price and manufacturers participating in MDRP
- It is important to understand the different types of pricing loaded to 340B accounts
- PVP secure website resources are available to participants to support compliant purchasing
